

Scottish Leg Route Details - Thursday 29th & Friday 30th January 2026

The rally features a 1,500-mile journey from the north of Scotland to Monte Carlo by the Mediterranean.

- Start (Jan 29): John O' Groats (approx. 8:30 am).
- Stop 1 (Jan 29): Inverness (Columba Hotel, approx. 11:00 am).
- Stop 2 (Jan 29): Glencoe (Kingshouse Hotel, approx. 2:30 pm).
- Stop 3 (Jan 29): Stirling Castle (approx. 4:30 pm) for a "Monte Fest" and parade.
- Overnight (Jan 29): North Queensferry (Doubletree Hotel).
- Final Scottish Stop (Jan 30): Jedburgh (Abbey Car Park, approx. 10:00 am).

Day 2 – Friday 30th January 2026



On to Jedburgh to the south east of Edinburgh. Jedburgh Abbey lies on south facing slopes on the north bank of the Jed Water, close to the centre of Jedburgh. It was founded, initially as a priory, by King David I in 1138.

Further Journey - after leaving Scotland, the route passes through **Pierce Bridge** and **York** before taking a ferry from **Hull** to Rotterdam, en route to the final destination in Monte Carlo, Monaco.

Piercebridge is a village and civil parish in the borough of Darlington and the ceremonial county of Durham, England. It is situated a few miles west of the town of Darlington.

Arrive at **Hull** for the overnight ferry to Rotterdam.

Day 3 – Saturday 31st January 2026

Due to arrive at Rotterdam to continue the 1,500 mile journey to Monte Carlo in Monaco.
