## Uninsured vehicles

Continuous Insurance Enforcement (CIE) rules in England, Wales and Scotland.

You must have motor insurance for your vehicle if you use it on roads and in public places. You do not need to insure your vehicle if it is kept off the road and declared as off the road (SORN). This rule is called 'continuous insurance enforcement' or CIE.

If this is not the case, you could:

- get a fixed penalty of £100.
- have your vehicle wheel-clamped, impounded or destroyed.
- face a court prosecution, with a possible maximum fine of £1,000.

It doesn't matter who is driving the car - if you're the registered keeper, you could get penalised. You will also still have to pay for your insurance on top of any fines received.
