

# Vehicle traffic changes in Great Britain 1973 to 2018

billion miles Year 1973: 146.6 2018: 328.1

Increase: 181.5 126.8%


Note: the drop in traffic miles from 1973 to 1975 seen in the chart above was during the Suez crisis and the OPEC oil embargo.

The following figures show the reductions in traffic levels in 1974 compared to 1973:


Month	% Change in Traffic Levels (1974 on 1972)	% Change in Traffic Levels (1974 on 1973)
April	4.6	-4.4
May	2.3	-1.3
June	3.3	-6.5
July	-1.4	-6.9
August	3.2	-3.8
September	1.0	-5.3
October	2.0	-1.1
November	3.0	-1.4
December	0.6	13.3

These reductions in traffic levels at the time when traffic levels were generally rising at around 5% pa. There is no doubt that traffic levels fell in 1973/74 in response to the sharply increased fuel prices when petrol doubled from 36p to 72p per gallon, and also to the recession conditions in 1974.

# Vehicle traffic in Great Britain 1993 to 2018




# Regional increase in vehicle traffic in the UK
